Wherefore take unto you the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand" (Ephesians 6:10, 13).

When Jerusalem was under siege and about to fall, God spoke through the prophet saying, "This is what the Lord says: 'Stand at the crossroads and look; ask for the ancient paths, where the good way is, and walk in it, and you will find rest for your souls" (Jeremiah 6:16). His words are our good marching orders as we stand on the 2024 threshold. Let us hold fast to His Word, pray much, and walk where He leads. Let us not be as those who responded to Jeremiah's admonition, saying, "We will not walk in it."
